Our top tip:

"Although on EMIS there is a code for patients reporting muscle symptoms e.g. muscle pain or fatigue, this may not be related to statin use. As a result one has to manually look through the medical notes which can be arduous. However, In addition to the search and GP screening the list, we also conduct the preeligibility screening phone call for patients who have responded positively to further establish eligibility."
